English

In reading this term we will continue to focus on reading accurately all the 44 phonemes in order to build up fluency and confidence. Alongside this it is important for pupils to read, on sight, the common exception words in order for them to read more speedily.

It is important that children develop a love of reading so we will read a variety of texts including fiction, poetry, plays and non-fiction in order for them to have a breadth of texts. The children will answer oral and written questions on the text so that they understand both the books they can already read accurately and fluently and those they listen to. Comprehension is key!

There will be a big focus this term on spelling. Spelling patterns will be taught alongside the common exception words for year 2. We will be writing reports, instructions, stories and information texts.

Maths

We will continue to work on the 4 operations with a focus on multiplication and division particularly in problem solving activities. We will focus on the 2's, 5's and 10's times tables and use mental recall of these to solve multiplication problems. Parents can help their children to learn their tables at home. Also, we will be measuring length, weight and capacity in practical contexts and finding fractions of shapes and amounts.

In History we will be looking at the life of Neil Armstrong and his part in the race to space. As the main focus of our topic is space, we will be learning about Gustav Holst, the famous composer who wrote The Planet Suite.

Our Geography focus will take us to Australia and we will be comparing our lives with children in Australia and studying the climate, geographical features and animals.
